

**SYRACUSE CITY**  
**NOTICE TO RESIDENTS REGARDING THE**  
**PREPARATION OF ARGUMENTS FOR OR AGAINST**  
**RECREATION, ARTS, and PARKS (RAP) TAX.**

The Syracuse City Council adopted Resolution R17-24 to submit an opinion question to the residents of Syracuse City, Utah, regarding the imposition of a local sales tax of 0.1% on eligible transactions within the City for recreational, arts, and parks uses.

The opinion question will be included on the November 7 Municipal General Election ballot as follows: Shall Syracuse City, Utah, be authorized to impose a 0.1% sales and use tax for the development and operating expenses of parks, recreational and cultural facilities, and the support of cultural organizations within Syracuse City?

To prepare an argument for or against the ballot proposition, eligible voters must file a request with the Election Officer, City Recorder Cassie Brown, at least 65 days before the General Election; valid requests must be received by September 5, 2017 at 5:00 p.m. Upon approval of the request, the voter must ensure that their argument does not exceed 500 words in length, shall submit the argument no later than September 8, 2017 at 5:00 p.m., and provide the following: voter's name, residential address, postal address, email address (if applicable), and phone number.
