As I reflect on the recent tragedies in Orlando, Florida; Dallas, Texas; Nice, France; and Baton Rouge, Louisiana, I have to ask, "What can we do to stay safe in Syracuse?"

Looking back over the last couple of decades, I have seen an erosion of our principles and values that has given rise to violence that is incomprehensible. I thought about when Thomas Jefferson was penning these words to the Declaration of Independence, "We hold these truths to be self-evident [obvious, unmistakable and undeniable], that all men are created equal [no matter your race, creed or color, every person is created equal. This does not mean we are guaranteed the same incomes or possessions, but it does acknowledge that we are creations, not accidents of nature], that they are endowed by their Creator ... [Yes, endowed from above to serve others]."

On March 6, 1776, General George Washington wrote, "Thursday, the 7th ... being set apart ... as a Day of Fasting, Prayer and Humiliation, to implore the Lord and Giver of all victory [the Almighty] ... to bless the Continental army with His divine favor and protection ..." Emergency Communications Notification Preparedness

Most of us want to be informed as soon as possible when an emergency occurs that may affect our home or family. One way information will be distributed to Syracuse residents in an emergency is by way of voice and text notice through the CodeRed Public Notification System for landline phone and mobile phone alerts. This is a system used locally and nation-wide, but it does require free registration by you to enable you to receive alerts from Davis County Emergency Services and Syracuse City.

In preparation for National Preparedness Month this September, we encourage everyone who lives or works in our community to **REGISTER** your cellular-mobile and/or landline phone with CodeRed, by logging on to the Syracuse Web Page at www.Syracuseut.com click the 'Your Government' tab, then click the 'Emergency Resources' drop-down. At the top of the page is a link to CodeRed. Register your phones and spread the word to your neighbors and those who may need help with Internet registration of their phone.


In September Syracuse City will send out a test CodeRed message so you will know how the system works, and to make sure your registration is effective. Don't procrastinate! Register today!

2016 Secondary Water User Notice

Syracuse City has been experiencing high demands on the secondary water system. Water supply is at its full allocation and is set at maximum flow rates entering the system. Water demand is controlled by users and is exceeding the supply of water. When reservoirs are low, there is not enough water in the system to maintain pressure in the tank, which is affecting a vast majority of the city. Syracuse City is asking all of our water users to implement water conservation practices by **watering two days each week at 20 to 30 minutes per setting.** Any two days of the week may be selected except on Wednesdays. **Wednesdays Will Be Mandatory No Watering Days Citywide** in order to allow our reservoirs to refill. We strongly recommend that good judgment be used when utilizing secondary water. We have included some simple considerations that may help us be more responsible in conserving this precious resource.

- Apply water anytime between 6:00 PM and 10:00 AM when temperatures are lower.
- Adjust water sprinklers and spray heads to prevent overspray that is wasted into the gutters, streets and storm drains.
- Periodically check for leaks in the sprinkler system and make repairs as necessary.
- Hose watering should not be left unattended.
- Turn off sprinklers during moderate to high winds, during and immediately after rainstorm downpours as well as mild rainstorm events lasting more than 20 minutes.
- Small garden areas may be supplemented more frequently with water using conscientious efforts to remain attentive.
- New landscape areas and areas where grass must be established from seed are able to responsibly apply water more frequently, as needed.

Syracuse City now offers passport application processing services. Applications will be accepted at City Hall between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Applicants are encouraged to call ahead to make an appointment; walk-ins will be accepted, though there may be a longer wait period. Helpful tips for applying for a passport can be found at <https://travel.state.gov/content/passports/en/passports/apply.html> At the time of application, applicants must present a completed application (this can be printed from the website named above), a certified U.S. Birth Certificate, and valid photo identification. Applicants can also choose to bring their own passport photo, but photo services will be available at City Hall for a \$10 charge. A cost breakdown for passport issuance is as follows:

- Passport Book: **\$110** (valid for all international travel)
- Passport Card: **\$30** (valid only for return to the U.S. by land or sea from Canada, Mexico, Bermuda, and the Caribbean)
- Passport Book & Card: **\$140**
- Execution Fee: **\$25**

Application fees **must** be paid with a **check or money order** and made payable to the U. S. Department of State. Syracuse City's execution fee of \$25 can be paid with a credit card.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

Off Street Parking provisions - SCC 10.40.030

B) Location of Off-Street Parking. Parking areas, as required by this chapter, shall be hard surfaces located on the same lot as the main building or structure. (C) Prohibited Locations. It shall be unlawful to park a **motor vehicle, trailer, or boat** in a front yard area, as defined in SCC 10.10.040, on any residential property or on areas not improved for parking.

Residents may use paved driveways leading directly to or adjacent to a garage as an approved parking area for additional vehicles to meet the requirements of this chapter. Acceptable 'hard surfaces' include asphalt, cement, or gravel. If using gravel, please keep it free of weeds and/or grass.

Storm Water Drains

While working on vehicles or small engines do not wash parts or equipment in a shop sink, parking lot, driveway or street. Instead, scrape parts with a wire brush and sweep up, or use a bake oven rather than liquid cleaners. If a spill happens, clean it up immediately by using absorbents such as rags, kitty litter or sand. When washing a vehicle please wash it on the lawn or at a local car wash. This will help to prevent any pollutants from entering the storm drain system. **Remember only rain down the drain!**

Modern Cash Market Building Move Update.

In early July the Museum Foundation Board held a specially convened meeting to be appraised of the latest details regarding the planned move of the former Modern Cash Market to the museum property. Over the past year, members of the Board have been actively engaged with this project and have met numerous times with Syracuse City officials in regards to the many aspects of this involved project.

Thanks to the many generous donors we had reached the goal of the cost of moving the building, but preparing a foundation was still in question. At the Friday meeting it was brought to our attention that if the building were successfully relocated, it would no longer meet current building and seismic codes. Before the building could be occupied it would need to have extensive reinforcement and stabilization. This would come at a cost that is far beyond what we could foresee raising. **After a serious discussion, we voted unanimously to abandon the project.** This decision was not made easily and we all had heavy hearts. The building will now be razed and another piece of old Syracuse will be lost.

We are currently contacting those donors who gave so generously toward this project to arrange refunds. We regret that after a year's effort this is the outcome, but are grateful to all those, near and far, who supported this endeavor in any way.

The museum will reopen on August 2nd, T-Th, 2-5 pm. Please stop by and visit us.
