POLICE DEPARTMENT

Looking for ways to save time and money this summer? Syracuse Police Department has a few suggestions. 1) Close your garage door. 2) Lock the doors to your home, business, and vehicles. 3) Do not leave valuable items in your vehicles. These three suggestions take almost no effort, take almost no time, and cost nothing, yet statistics prove that if you follow these simple suggestions, you can almost eliminate your chance of being a victim of a burglary.

Burglaries often increase during this time of year. From January 1st through April 30th, the city experienced a combined total of 16 reported business, residential, and vehicle burglaries. From May 1st through June 14th, there were 22. It is unfortunate that people have been victims, but 90% of these crimes reported from May 1st to June 14th might have been avoided if the vehicles, garages, or businesses were secured. You can save money by not having to replace valuable items or file insurance claims; you can save time by not having to track down receipts or take time off from work to file a police report.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Ready to celebrate the holidays this summer?

Fireworks are a wonderful way to celebrate holidays, but they must be used carefully! Again, we are encouraging individuals and families to be **fireworks smart** before, during, and after their fireworks display.

As a reminder, here are the **2016** Fireworks purchase and discharge dates: Class ‘C’ (consumer grade fireworks) may be sold and purchased June 23rd through July 27. Fireworks are allowed to be discharged between the hours of **11am and 11pm, July 1st through July 7th** (July 4th hours extended to midnight), and again **July 21st through July 27th** (July 24th hours extended to midnight).

As usual, we stress that everyone pay particular attention to safety recommendations and safety tips from manufacturers and retailers who sell fireworks. Follow all safety guidelines exactly.

There are no restrictions to fireworks this year, but if you live near a dry grassy field or agriculture, only the following Syracuse parks are available for small fireworks display: **Founder's, Bluff Ridge or Freemont Parks.**

If you use the parks, you must pick-up and remove any debris left by your fireworks. We hope you will help us keep our community clean and safe during all your recreation events this summer!

PUBLIC WORKS

For those who clean and maintain vehicles at home, please make sure you clean up any spills immediately by using absorbents such as rags, kitty litter or sand then dispose of it properly. If the material spilled is hazardous (solvents, gas, oil, etc.), dispose of the soiled absorbents at a hazardous waste facility. If the material spilled is not hazardous, dispose of these items in the trash. If you choose to wash your vehicle at home the best place is on the lawn. This prevents pollutants from running down the driveway and into the storm drain. REMEMBER: ONLY RAIN DOWN THE STORM DRAIN.

Road construction is occurring in various locations throughout the city. The city website and Facebook pages are kept current with road construction updates. Please use caution while traveling through or around construction zones and follow all construction signs. Your patience is appreciated during construction. Tree roots or heat temperatures may cause sidewalks to buckle creating trip hazards. Syracuse City now offers passport application processing services. Applications will be accepted at City Hall between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Applicants are encouraged to call ahead to make an appointment; walk-ins will be accepted, though there may be a longer wait period. Helpful tips for applying for a passport can be found at <https://travel.state.gov/content/passports/en/passports/apply.html> At the time of application, applicants must present a completed application (this can be printed from the website named above), a certified U.S. Birth Certificate, and valid photo identification. Applicants can also choose to bring their own passport photo, but photo services will be available at City Hall for a \$10 charge. A cost breakdown for passport issuance is as follows:

- Passport Book: **\$110** (valid for all international travel)
- Passport Card: **\$30** (valid only for return to the U.S. by land or sea from Canada, Mexico, Bermuda, and the Caribbean)
- Passport Book & Card: **\$140**
- Execution Fee: **\$25**

Application fees **must** be paid with a check or money order and made payable to the U. S. Department of State, Syracuse City's execution fee of \$25 can be paid with a credit card.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

(D) Lights and Signs Prohibited on Public Property. No sign, light standard, or pole shall be erected on publicly owned land inside street rights-of-way, or otherwise. No sign, handbill, poster, advertisement, or notice of any kind or sort, whether political or otherwise, shall be fastened, placed, posted, painted, or attached in any way in or upon any curbstone, lamp post, telephone pole, telegraph pole, electric light or power pole, hydrant, bridge, tree, rock, sidewalk, or street right-of-way.
