## MAYOR'S MESSAGE

In March we will start seeing work done on 2000 West in preparation for widening the road from Antelope Drive to 300 North in West Point. In this first phase, UDOT will be marking utility, sewer, and drain lines. During the year Andrew Sherman's office on the east side of 2000 West will be removed, as well as various homes on the west side of the road between the junior high and Sorensen Companies Inc. (SCI).

In addition to the preliminary work on 2000 West, a CVS Pharmacy will be built on the northeast corner of Antelope Drive and 2000 West. This has already passed final approval of the City Council and should be completed by the end of the summer.

Syracuse is continuing to grow at a very fast pace. We had approximately 250 new home permits issued in 2015 and I'm sure the growth will continue in 2016.

This spring we will see construction at a couple of our parks. Centennial Park will have restrooms built and two soccer fields will be added to Rock Creek Park.

## POLICE DEPARTMENT

### Fingerprinting

Syracuse Police Department offers fingerprinting Mondays from 2:00PM-4:00PM and Fridays 9:00AM-12:00PM, excluding holidays. For residents of Syracuse, or those who show proof that they work for a business in Syracuse and need fingerprints as part of their employment, the fee is \$10.00 per card. For all others, the fee will be \$15.00 per card.

### Emergency Preparedness

The Syracuse City CERT Team is starting a six week CERT course on March 2<sup>nd</sup> and will run through April 13<sup>th</sup> (no class March 30<sup>th</sup> due to Spring Break) with the mock disaster on April 16<sup>th</sup>. It will be taught each Wednesday from 6-9 PM and will have a cost of \$45 dollars to cover the cost of the awesome emergency gear/shirt you will receive during the class (not required if you don't need/want the gear).

## FIRE DEPARTMENT

### Change your Clock and...

You know the rest of the statement right? Yes! *Change the battery in your smoke detector!* Daylight Saving Time begins Sunday March 13<sup>th</sup>. I want to add another safe practice with the change to Daylight Savings Time, and that is to clean your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors by using your vacuum with the hose attachment, brushing around the outside of each one to remove any dust or spider-webs that have collected there.

These are life-saving safety devices that we have come to depend on, but they are only as good as the maintenance they receive. By maintaining the alarms in your home, you can increase your chances of surviving a fire or carbon monoxide poisoning. When fire breaks out, every second counts to escape its heat, black smoke, and deadly gases. Carbon monoxide is a poisonous gas that fuel-burning heating and cooking devices often produce. It is often called the silent killer because it is odorless and colorless. The National Fire Protection Association offers tips for making your home safer:

- Place smoke and carbon monoxide alarms on every level of your home and outside each bedroom. If you keep your bedroom doors closed, place a smoke alarm in each bedroom;
- Test alarms once a month;
- Never disable a smoke alarm when cooking; and
- Replace smoke alarms that are ten years old.

## BUSINESS LICENSING

Business License renewals were past due as of December 31, 2015. Late Fee Charges will be assessed at 50% of the annual fee starting **February 1st**. If you did not receive your renewal letter or have misplaced it, please call Debbie Rainford at 801-614-9627 to make a payment. ## HOUSEHOLD AND GREEN WASTE RECYCLING

**4.50.080** Time and place of pickup.

(A) All household waste and green waste recyclable materials subject to collection by the City shall be placed on the edge of the street next to the driveway on the opposite side of the driveway approach from the mailbox, but in no event within 10 feet of the mailbox, and with the container's wheels as close to the curb as reasonably possible, with the hinge thereof to curbside and the lid opening facing toward the street. When snow or street construction prevents placing of the container against the curb, the container shall be placed not over two feet from the edge of said snow or construction and in a manner that will not obstruct traffic or unduly impede the snowplowing activities of the City. (B) Containers shall not be placed or permitted to block driveways or through traffic. (C) Until otherwise provided by regulation, containers must not be set out upon the street for collection prior to the evening of the day before collection and must be set out prior to 6:00 a.m. on the day of collection. **Waste containers that have been emptied shall be removed from the street right-of-way within 24 hours after containers are emptied.**
