## POLICE DEPARTMENT

On April 4, 2016, Syracuse Police Department arrested two suspects in connection with two residential burglaries. The suspects entered two separate homes in Syracuse, resulting in several valuable items being stolen out of the homes. The suspects were seen on surveillance cameras and were later identified from the footage. Syracuse Police located the suspects and were able to make an arrest within a week of the incident occurring. Both suspects are being charged with Burglary of a Dwelling, a second degree felony.

Several of the items taken were recovered due to the victim having a record of serial numbers and pictures of the items. This documentation played an important role in the investigation because the police were able to positively identify the items as they recovered them. Additionally, this type of documentation also allows the police to list the stolen items in a national database. Syracuse Police Department urges residents to take photographs and keep a record of serial numbers for high value items they own. ## FIRE DEPARTMENT

Spring is upon us, and with it, yard clean up! The need to dispose of yard debris is on everyone's mind. The Davis County Fire Board of Appeals and County Fire Marshal have agreed that due to the impact on air quality, there will not be a time period set aside for open burning in Davis County in 2016.

Exemptions: Farm and horticultural operations may burn as established under current law and air quality rules. In Syracuse City our ordinance (Title 7 Chapter 4) states, open burning of brush, leaves, grass clippings, and crop stubble is allowed only at properties in an agricultural zone, properties containing twenty (20) or more trees, or properties at least two (2) acres in size. If you live near a farm or agricultural zone, you may see some permitted controlled burning. These fires should always be constantly supervised.

Recreational fires including campfires and fires used solely for cooking, ceremonial, or recreational purposes where such fires do not create a nuisance and are under the control of a responsible person may be permitted.

Homeowners may not burn any kind of refuse, including prunings, rubbish, debris, or garbage in their yards. Such items should be shredded for mulch or hauled to the local landfill.

## PUBLIC WORKS

**Water:** Now is the time to check your sprinkler system filters and clean or replace as necessary. Please also check for broken or clogged sprinkler heads. With secondary water turned on, adjust sprinkler heads to avoid overwatering of driveways, streets and sidewalks. If your water pressure seems low, fill out a Fix It Request form on the city website [www.syracuseut.com](http://www.syracuseut.com) or call the public works office 801-825-7235. Tampering with the City-owned stop-and-waste valve is prohibited. .

Syracuse City is excited to begin offering passport application processing services beginning **May 31, 2016**. Applications will be accepted at City Hall between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Applicants are encouraged to call ahead to make an appointment; walk-ins will be accepted, though

there may be a longer wait period. Helpful tips for applying for a passport can be found at <https://travel.state.gov/content/passports/en/passports/apply.html>. At the time of application, applicants must present a completed application (this can be printed from the website named above), a certified U.S. Birth Certificate, and valid photo identification. Applicants can also choose to bring their own passport photo, but photo services will be available at City Hall for a \$10 charge. A cost breakdown for passport issuance is as follows:

- Passport Book: **\$110** (valid for all international travel)
- Passport Card: **\$30** (valid only for return to the U.S. by land or sea from Canada, Mexico, Bermuda, and the Caribbean.)
- Passport Book & Card: **\$140.**
- Execution Fee: **\$25**


Applicants are encouraged to pay passport application fees with a check. Credit cards will be accepted, but there will be an additional \$2.00 fee for Syracuse City to process a check to send to the U.S. State Department with the passport applications. ## CODE ENFORCEMENT

**Miscellaneous requirements and provisions 10.30.060**  
(B) Visibility at Intersections. Notwithstanding any provisions of this title in any district, fences, walls, signs, hedges, or other plantings may not encroach within the required clear visibility triangle located at the intersection of two roads or the intersection of a road and a nonresidential driveway. No one shall erect, place, or plant anything or allow anything to grow in such a manner as to impede vision between a height of two and one-half feet and eight feet above centerline grades of the adjoining street centerline surface elevation. Property owners shall maintain all tree branches so that none of them are lower than eight feet in clear site triangle area. Clear visibility triangle shown in Exhibit 10.30.060
