POLICE DEPARTMENT

One of the six pillars identified by the President's Task Force on 21st Century Policing deals with Community Policing & Crime Prevention. The staff at Syracuse Police Department selected this pillar as an area of focus for 2016. Here are some highlights of what we have accomplished this year:

- We worked with the Syracuse Chamber of Commerce to develop a Business Watch program.
- We worked with the Emergency Coordination System to start a Neighborhood Watch program.
- We held a special training session with school administrators prior to the start of the school year to discuss drug trends, gang involvement, and school related safety issues.
- We made arrangements with www.crimereports.com so we can share information on police activities with our community.
- We are sending two officers to RadKids training later this month; RadKids is a safety class for children that we anticipate bringing to our city in summer of 2017.
- We held our 2nd annual Night Out Against Crime event. It was very successful, and we would like to thank our community for the amazing support.
- Syracuse Police Department now has its own Facebook page separate from Syracuse City. We anticipate that this page will help us better connect and interact with our community.

It is our sincere desire to build on our strong history of working with residents and the business community in order to reduce crime, increase safety, and keep Syracuse a great place to live, work, and visit.

FIRE DEPARTMENT



Fire Prevention Week is October 9-15. This year's theme is **"Don't Wait – Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years."** This is the third year in a row where focus is on public education for one of the most basic and essential elements of smoke alarm safety.

The National Fire Protection Association's survey data shows that many people have misconceptions about smoke alarms, which may put them at increased risk in the event of a home fire. For example, only a small percentage of people know how old their smoke alarms are, or how often they need to be replaced. To find out how old a smoke alarm is, look at the date of manufacture on the back of the alarm; the alarm should be replaced 10 years from that date.

Syracuse Fire Department is ready to serve you 24 hours a day 365 days a year. We take our job seriously with customer service being our priority. PUBLIC WORKS

Secondary Water will be turned off **October 15, 2016** then we will begin winterizing our system. We suggest you winterize your systems as well.

Storm Drains - With Winter slowly creeping upon us please take any material storage inside or cover with a water proof material to prevent any Pollutants from entering into the storm drain system, due to rainfall and snowfall. When cleaning with disinfectant wipes, please throw them into the garbage and not into the sanitary sewer system. This will help prevent any sewer backups in the sewer system.

Tree Trimming - Remember the 7-11 rule. 7 feet clearance over the sidewalk and 11 feet over the street.

Leaves -. Public Works does not collect your bags of leaves. Residents are responsible to dispose of leaves properly in either the green or black garbage cans.

Passport application processing services are offered at City Hall between 900am - 400pm, processing takes approximately 30 minutes per application. Applicants are encouraged to make an appointment; walk-ins will be accepted, though there may be a longer wait period.

At the time of application, applicants **must present** a completed application and Certified U.S. Birth Certificate and Valid Photo Identification. Applications can be filled out and printed from the travel.state.gov website.

Application fees **must** be paid with a **Check or Money Order** and made payable to the **U.S. Department of State**
