## MAYOR'S MESSAGE



It has been a hot summer with very little moisture. Thank you for reducing secondary watering to only twice a week this has helped keep our reservoirs full.

The industrial area east of the power lines along Highway 193 is progressing well and two new businesses will be opening within the next few months. We also have businesses interested in the two remaining parcels in the industrial park.

UDOT is doing an overlay on 1700 South west of 2000 West and should be completed soon. In the early spring, UDOT will be working on two projects in Syracuse simultaneously. One will be widening 2000 West from 1700 South to 300 North in West Point. The other will be extending Highway 193 from 2000 West to 3000 West. These projects should be completed by Christmas 2017 and will help alleviate much of the traffic issues along 2000 West.

Remember to be alert to school zones now that children are back in school. Children are our most precious resource in Syracuse and we want them to be safe. With the construction issues, it is imperative that we be even more vigilant in observing traffic laws.

## POLICE DEPARTMENT

Syracuse Police Department has made arrangements with Crime Reports to share information on police activities with the public. This system is free to the City and free to all users. Since it is a free service we do not have access to all features, such as submitting a tip electronically through the system, but it will help residents have a better understanding of what police related activities are occurring in our community.

To access the system, go to [www.crimereports.com](http://www.crimereports.com). On the search line, enter Syracuse Utah. Using the advanced search features, you can set a date range and select the types of police activities you would like to see. For further details, click on any of the balloon icons that appear on the map.

For safety reasons, the police activities are not populated to the map in real-time; they populate the following day. Additionally, not all types of police activities are populated to the map. For example, cases of a sexual nature, domestic violence, and activities that were primarily generated for medical assistance will not show up on the map.

## FIRE DEPARTMENT

September is National Preparedness Month, and the *Ready* ([www.ready.gov](http://www.ready.gov)) Campaign recently announced the 2016 theme: **Don't Wait. Communicate. Make Your Emergency Plan Today.**

Now is the time to be sure you can communicate during emergencies by having up-to-date contact information for those you may need to get in touch with during a disaster. Establish alternate methods of communication in case traditional means are not available.

Making a **Family Emergency Communication Plan** is a great way to prepare for disasters, but testing your plan is even better so you'll be familiar with how to respond.

Residents of Syracuse are encouraged to register your phone number with **CodeRed**, the Public Notification System for landline phone and mobile phone alerts used by Davis County. Just log on to the Syracuse Web Page at [www.Syracuseut.com](http://www.Syracuseut.com) click the 'Your Government' tab, then click the 'Emergency Resources' drop-down. At the top of the page is a link to **CodeRed**. Register your phones and spread the word to your neighbors and those who may need help with Internet registration of their phone.

On **SEPTEMBER 15<sup>th</sup>**, Syracuse City will send out a test **CodeRed** message so you will know how the system works, and to make sure your registration is effective. Don't procrastinate! Register today!

## PUBLIC WORKS

### Tree Trimming

Trees provide shade and appeal to our city and we welcome trees that provide such benefits. As with many things, these trees require maintenance for good health to the trees and others around them. In order to protect trees that extend over the sidewalks and roadways from being damaged by vehicles and pedestrians, trees must be pruned to allow a clearance of seven feet over a sidewalk and eleven feet over a street. This clearance not only allows service vehicles such as garbage trucks, mail delivery, and street maintenance full unobstructed access, but also increases visibility to traffic signs and street lamps. Our Ordinance [10.30.070\(J\)](#) describes this maintenance requirement in greater detail.

### Secondary Water

As temperatures cool down lawns require less water. Please adjust your sprinkler systems accordingly. Remember to turn off your systems during and right after rainy weather.

### Hazardous Waste

Dispose of household hazardous waste, used auto fluids (antifreeze, oil, etc.) and batteries at a designated collection or recycling Location. Also clean paint brushes in a sink, not outdoors and dispose of excess paint through a hazardous waste collection program. Please help prevent these kinds of items from getting into the storm drains.

Syracuse City now offers passport application processing services at City Hall between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Applicants are encouraged to call ahead to make an appointment; walk-ins will be accepted, though there may be a longer wait period.

**At the time of application, applicants must present a completed application (this can be printed from the website named above), a certified U.S. Birth Certificate, and valid photo identification.**

A cost breakdown for passport issuance is as follows:

- Passport Book Adult: **\$110** (valid for all international travel)
- Passport Book Minor: **\$80** (under age 16)
- Passport Card: **\$30** Adult / **\$15** Minor (valid only for return to the U.S. by land or sea from Canada, Mexico, Bermuda, and the Caribbean)
- Passport Book & Card: **\$140** Adult / **\$95** Minor
- Expedite Fee: **\$60**
- Execution Fee: **\$25** (can pay with credit card)
- Passport Photo: **\$10** (can pay with credit card)

Application fees **must** be paid with a **check or money order** and made payable to the **U. S. Department of State**

## CODE ENFORCEMENT

The City Council recently approved changes to the Syracuse City Land Use & Traffic Codes:

**SCC 10.40.030** Motor vehicles, trailers or boats can now be parked on side/back yards (not front yards) so long as the grass or weeds are maintained to a height below 6 inches. Corner lots require a 6' opaque fence that runs along the right-of-way.

**SCC 11.20.030 & SCC 11.20.040** Motor vehicles between 10,000 - 50,000 lbs & 20 - 24 feet shall not be parked on any City Street or right-of-way in residential zones for longer than 24 hours. Trailers used in the course of business shall not be parked overnight on any City street or right-of-way in any residential zones. Does not apply to construction trailers with active building permits. Trailers or RV's may not be used for sleeping or habitation while parked on a City street or public right-of-way. Trailers or RV's with a 'bump out' feature are not allowed while parked on a City street or public right-of-way.
