Meter Reading: Between October and March, water meters are not read. During that time, residents are billed a flat 8,000 gallons per month. In April, meters are read once again. Roads Department: Check our website to view where and when construction and maintenance is occurring. This is found by clicking: *Departments; Public Works; Road construction updates.*

Currently Under Construction: 3000 W from 200 S to the intersection of 3000 W and Bluff Rd. *Please slow down in the construction zones*

Secondary Water Conservation: We want to remind you to continue in your efforts of water conservation. Please visit www.weberbasin.com to review resources available to help improve water efficiency.

Irrigation Season: Will begin the week of April 15th. Updated information can be found on the city website by clicking: *Departments; Public Works Info.* Please ensure your system is ready for irrigation season by closing all valves and spigots tightly to avoid flooding your home or property. Now is a great time to install a secondary water shut-off valve and filter, or to clean and/or replace your existing filter. Having your own shut-off valve allows you to maintain your system, without having to wait for a Syracuse City employee to turn off the City owned secondary water valve in the event of a broken pipe. Tampering with any City owned utility is strictly prohibited (ord. 4-6 -12). If you have installed a new sprinkler system, and are ready for the water to be turned on, contact Public Works at (801) 825-7235.

Cemetery : As mowing season approaches, please refer to the Syracuse website (Departments, Public Works, Syracuse Cemetery) for ordinances pertaining to Decoration of graves at the Cemetery.

Spring Clean-up: Let's all do our part to protect our storm water by sweeping gutters and cleaning the storm drain grates that may be in front of or near our homes. This will help avert debris and pollutants from entering the storm drain system and traveling downstream.
