MAYOR'S MESSAGE

August should be a fun month. We have the Tour of Utah coming to Syracuse on August 5. This will be the third leg of a major bike race and will start on Antelope Island at 10:00 a.m. The bikers will ride across the causeway and east on Antelope Drive to 2000 West before heading north. This leg of the race will be a grueling 109 miles of competitive riding reminiscent of the Tour de France with climbs over North Ogden Pass, around Pineview Reservoir, across Trappers Loop and down the canyon to Highway 89. This leg of the race will end with a trip up 400 North in Bountiful, around the LDS Temple, down into Bountiful, and will be finished in 4.45 hours.

Syracuse will have the opportunity to send the riders off from the island and I would like to see us celebrate with possibly a cook off the night before or on Wednesday morning with a breakfast. This will be an opportunity to meet some of the top riders on the circuit. We would like your involvement and are open for suggestions to help us make this a big event and a great send off for the riders.

CULINARY WATER DISCOUNT

The City takes great pride in providing reliable and quality services and recognizes the disruption in culinary water service due to the recent cross contamination. The Syracuse City Council voted on June 23rd to issue a \$2.05 fee waiver on each resident's \$16.50 monthly culinary water, which is the equivalent of approximately 1,000 gallons per home. This fee waiver will be applied to all utility bills due on July 25th.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Fire Hydrants: In coordination with Public Works and the Water Department, firefighters will be flowing fire hydrants throughout the city this summer beginning in July. There are many reasons for this, including ensuring the integrity of the fire hydrant hardware and documentation of the pressures and gallon-per-minute flows the hydrant can provide.

One of the noticeable side effects of these hydrant flows is a temporary discoloration of the water in the immediate area of the flow. When a hydrant is opened, the sediment in the main is stirred which creates murky water. Be assured there is nothing wrong with the water, and it will clear in a short time.

In an effort to keep you informed, city officials will send occasional Reverse911 notifications to advise citizens living in the geographic area of the city where crews are flowing hydrants. If you have not registered for Reverse911, please see the link on www.syracuseut.com.

Municipal Elections Candidates for Office:

Congratulations to the following citizens who have declared their candidacy for the elective offices in Syracuse City : Three Councilmember Seats—Four Year Term: Andrea Anderson, Ryan Hatch, Kurt Jones, Karianne Lisonbee (incumbent), F. David Maughan, Randy Miller, Doug Peterson (incumbent), Gary Pratt, Daniel Schuler.

Election Dates: The Primary Election will be held August 11. Six candidates will advance to the General Election, which will be held November 3. All registered voters will be mailed a vote-by-mail ballot 28 days prior to Election Day. Ballots can be returned by-mail, at a drop location at City Hall, to the Community Center on Election Day. Those wishing to vote in person rather than vote-by-mail will have the opportunity to cast their ballot on voting machines on Election Day; polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Syracuse City Community Center, 1912 W. 1900 S. In order to vote in person, a registered voter must surrender their mailed ballot.

Voter Registration: Voter registration can be completed 30 days prior to Election Day via mail or online, or 15 days prior to Election Day in person in the office of the Davis County Clerk. Those that are not registered voters may visit the Davis County Website, <http://www.daviscountyutah.gov/clerk/auditor/elections>, or call or visit the City offices for a copy of the registration form. You must have been a resident of Syracuse City for at least 30 days to be able to participate in the primary election.

Register to Vote: Voter registration can be completed 30 days prior to election day via mail or online, or 15 days prior to election day in person in the office of the Davis County

UTILITY DEPARTMENT



The North Davis Sewer District raised its sewer fee by \$3.00 per month starting in July 2015. This will be reflected on your August 2015 utility bill. If you have any questions about this fee increase, you can contact the North Davis Sewer District at 801-825-0712.

Syracuse City approved its consolidated fee schedule for the fiscal year 2016. It goes into effect on July 1, 2015. As part of this approval, Syracuse City raised its late fee on delinquent utility accounts from \$10.00 to \$20.00 per occurrence. This is for all utility payments made 10 days after the 25th due date.

Syracuse City also approved a fee for excess sewer disposal over 5,500 gallons for commercial businesses only. Businesses will be charged \$1.55 per 1000 gallons of sewer disposal over 5,500 gallons and will be based on the businesses water usage for the month. This fee is collected by Syracuse City, but is charged by the North Davis Sewer District.
