MAYOR'S MESSAGE



Challenge 1: August 27, 2016 will be the second running of the Goliath Race in Syracuse. It is a one-of-a-kind 140.6 mile full distance iron triathlon relay race to be completed within 15 hours, 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. The race can be done in teams of up to 10 people and as little as one person. It includes a 2.4 mile swim, a 112 mile bike ride and a 26.2 mile run. The city council will be placing a team in the race. Get your team together and register to meet the challenge.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Summer is approaching and with it children will be outside more with less adult supervision. Syracuse Police Department would like to remind parents of the importance of teaching safety rules to their children. The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children suggest four simple rules of safety. These rules are:

- Check first.
- Take a friend.
- Tell people “No”
- Tell a trusted adult.

Recently, Syracuse Police Department handled two separate cases where suspicious individuals reportedly tried to lure children into their vehicles. All or some of these safety rules were used by the children and they prevailed. The Department would like to thank the community for being so diligent and willing to help in these cases.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

In coordination with Public Works and the Water Department, firefighters will be flowing fire hydrants throughout the city this summer beginning in June through October. There are many reasons for this, including ensuring the integrity of the fire hydrant hardware, water mains and documentation of the pressures and gallon-per-minute flows the hydrant can provide.

Residents and business owners can assist in this effort by keeping the area around a fire hydrant on your property clear of tall grass, shrubs or other obstacles for a six foot diameter around the hydrant to ensure visibility and access to the hydrant.

One of the noticeable side effects of these hydrant flows is a temporary discoloration of the water in the immediate area of the flow. When a hydrant is opened, the sediment in the main is stirred which creates murky water. Be assured there is nothing wrong with the water, and it will clear in a short time.

Information about flow testing locations will be available through the fire department at 801-614-9614 or Public Works Department at 801-825-7235. You will see uniformed firefighters flowing and servicing various hydrants throughout the city. Water Conservation Tips:

Avoid overwatering. Excess water will evaporate or run off before it can be absorbed into the soil. Adjust sprinklers to avoid watering sidewalks, driveways and streets. Don't set your automatic timer and leave it for the whole season. Adjust accordingly for weather changes. **Turn sprinklers off if it is raining.** Clean out your filters regularly. Check often for leaks.

Work Zone Safety Tips:

There are many street projects going on throughout the summer months. These can be frustrating for drivers, but in the end provide us with a more efficient and beautiful city. If you drive through a work zone: Stay alert! Don't tailgate. Obey the posted speed limit sign. Follow flagger instructions and be patient. When do you need an Excavation Permit?

Excavation permits are available on the City website under [Public Works Info](#). An excavation permit is required to widen a driveway approach, cut curb and gutter, and cut through existing sidewalk. Persons doing the work are required to be licensed and bonded, or a \$1000 refundable deposit must be placed with the city to cover any expenses or injury to city property.

Syracuse City is excited to begin offering passport application processing services beginning **May 31, 2016**. Applications will be accepted at City Hall between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Applicants are encouraged to call ahead to make an appointment; walk-ins will be accepted, though there may be a longer wait period. Helpful tips for applying for a passport can be found at <https://travel.state.gov/content/passports/en/passports/apply.html> At the time of application, applicants must present a completed application (this can be printed from the website named above), a certified U.S. Birth Certificate, and valid photo identification. Applicants can also choose to bring their own passport photo, but photo services will be available at City Hall for a \$10 charge. A cost breakdown for passport issuance is as follows:

- Passport Book: **\$110** (valid for all international travel)
- Passport Card: **\$30** (valid only for return to the U.S. by land or sea from Canada, Mexico, Bermuda, and the Caribbean)
- Passport Book & Card: **\$140.**
- Execution Fee: **\$25**

Application fees **must** be paid with a check or money order and made payable to the U. S. Department of State. Syracuse City's execution fee of \$25 can be paid with a credit card. Any questions regarding passport application processing services contact the City Recorder 801-614-9633.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

It is unlawful for any owner, occupant, agent, and/or lessee of real property in the City to fail to maintain the height of weeds and grasses, in the manner provided herein, on such property, or to fail to remove from the property any cuttings from such weeds or grasses.

Park Strips. It is unlawful for any owner, occupant, agent, and/or lessee of real property in the City abutting and bordering on any public street, for the distance such property abuts and borders the street, to fail to maintain the height of the weeds and grasses **Weed Control Specifications.**

Developed Lots: Weeds and grasses shall be maintained at a height of not more than **6 inches** at all times.

Undeveloped Lots: Weeds and grasses shall be maintained at a height of not more than **12 inches** at all times.
