MAYOR'S MESSAGE

I know it has been a long summer for residents along 3000 West. We appreciate your patience, comments and advice through the entire process. Construction, detours and orange cones have become part of our lives, but it is important that we drive on good roads and move traffic more efficiently.

With the completion of SR 193 on the north end of the city, traffic along 2000 West (SR 108) has impacted our driving time. Our next major project has now been approved on 2000 West from Antelope Drive to 300 North. This is a major project similar to the widening of Antelope Drive where 2000 West will become a five lane highway. There will be approximately 30 structures removed and the road construction is planned to begin in July 2017.

This will be an inconvenience, but will result in a much better flow of traffic moving in and out of Syracuse. One of the structures that will be removed is the historic building on the east side closest to Antelope Drive. We have received approval from UDOT to keep the building and move it by our museum. The Modern Cash Market, a grocery store, was built in 1926 when the population of Syracuse was about 700. I want to thank the Syracuse Museum volunteers for procuring 2/3 of the donations needed to move this important building.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

November typically brings the first snowfall in our area. It is a good time to issue a reminder about the City's winter parking ordinance and about winter driving safety.

In Syracuse, it is unlawful to park any vehicle within the public right-of-way of any street at any time during the accumulation or removal of snow. Vehicles parked on the street while it is snowing, or while snow is being removed, pose hazards to motorists; these vehicles also pose hazards to snowplows and slow down the snow removal process.

According to a 2005-2014 report from the Utah Highway Safety Office, the Thanksgiving holiday is tied for third as the most deadly holiday period for motorists. Some of the contributing factors include weather, fatigue, impaired driving, long distance travel, speeding, and traveling on unfamiliar roadways. Additionally, November was the second highest month for crashes in Syracuse in 2014. All of this serves as a reminder of the need to plan ahead, slow down, allow yourself extra time to reach your destination, and of course do not drive while impaired or overly tired.

PUBLIC WORKS

As the leaves change color and fall to the ground during this autumn season, please rake and sweep the gutters to help keep the leaves from entering into the storm drains. This prevents water from backing up due to blockage and stops some pollutants from entering the storm drain. Pollutants can have many adverse effects on plants, fish, animals and people. Let's all do our part. Only rain down the drain.

Tree Trimming: This is a good time of year to trim trees along the roads and sidewalks. Remember the 7/11 rule for trimming clearance: 7 feet above the sidewalk and 11 feet above the street.

UTILITIES

Meter Reading: October was the last month the meters were read for the season. The bill received in November will reflect this final read. Meters will be read again beginning in April 2016. Between November through March, residents are charged \$16.50 for water. The May 2016 bill will reflect charges for any water that is used over 8,000 gallons each month.

Green Waste: Our green waste season will continue through November 30th and resume again April 1, 2016. During the months of December-March you may use your green can for regular household waste.

Syracuse City Municipal Elections

The Syracuse City General Election will be held Tuesday, November 3, 2015. All registered should have received their ballot in the mail; if you have not received your ballot, please contact the City Recorder at 801-614-9633. Ballots can be returned by-mail, to a ballot box located within City Hall, or to the Community Center on Election Day. Those wishing to vote in person rather than vote-by-mail will have the opportunity to cast their ballot on voting machines on Election Day; polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Syracuse City Community Center, 1912 W 1900 S. In order to vote in person, a registered voter must surrender their mailed ballot. Voter registration can be completed 30 days prior to Election Day via mail, or seven days prior to Election Day online or in person in the office of the Davis County Clerk. Those that are not registered voters may visit the Davis County Website: www.daviscountyutah.gov/clerk-auditor/elections2 or call or visit the City offices for a copy of the registration form. You must have been a resident of Syracuse City for at least 30 days to be able to participate in the general election. Three Councilmember seats are up for election. Based on the results of the Primary Election, those candidates whose names will appear on the General Election ballot are as follows:

In recent months, the Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) has been working with the Shared Solution Coalition (Coalition) on the evaluation of the Coalition's "Shared Solution Alternative." Earlier this summer, the Wasatch Front Regional Council (WFRC) approved its 2015-2040 Regional Transportation Plan. This included new information about future travel patterns and an updated list of planned transportation projects. To maintain a thorough and data-driven study, UDOT will incorporate this new information into the alternative evaluation process, which will include the "Shared Solution Alternative." This way, all alternatives will be evaluated in a consistent manner with the most accurate and up to date information. UDOT remains committed to ensure the best possible decision is ultimately made for Davis and Weber counties.

UDOT has been working with WFRC to accurately incorporate this new information into the WDC study. This includes calibrating traffic models based on current traffic counts and confirming projections for future growth in the study area. Once the traffic models are ready, we will be able to update the screening evaluation for all of the alternatives.

We anticipate that this process will be completed by the end of this year. Then, the results will be published and an updated schedule will be released. For questions or concerns, please contact the study team at 877-298-1991 or westdavis@utah.gov
