POLICE DEPARTMENT

October is National Crime Prevention Month and Syracuse Police Department offers some tips to help the community prevent crime. From January 1, 2015, through September 1, 2015, there have been 58 vehicle burglaries and 25 home burglaries. 85% of these burglaries were unforced, meaning the vehicles and homes were left unsecured. This information demonstrates that the best way to avoid becoming a victim of these crimes is to simply lock doors on vehicles and homes. Additionally, remove valuables from your vehicles and keep garage doors closed. Another good crime prevention tip is to turn on outside lights at night. According to Rocky Mountain Power, it costs less than \$12.00 a year to operate five 8 watt LED lights for six hours. 

PUBLIC WORKS

Environmental Department:

What is storm water runoff? Storm water runoff is water from precipitation that flows across the ground and pavement due to rain or snowmelt. The water may seep into the ground or enter the storm drain system and flow into a nearby creek, stream or lake.

What is the difference between storm drains and sanitary sewer drains? Storm drains carry storm water runoff directly into streams without going through any type of treatment process. Sanitary sewer drains convey wastewater from homes, businesses and industries to a wastewater treatment plant where it is treated before being discharged into a stream.

Secondary Water Conservation:

The efforts being made to conserve water have been helpful. We appreciate those that have been vigilant in following the voluntary watering schedule this season. We must continue these efforts through the remainder of the irrigation season. **As our irrigation season ends October 1st, sprinkler systems can be prepared for winter.** As a reminder your culinary water is NOT to be hooked up with sprinkler systems. This causes a cross connection and can contaminate the drinking water. With water being a precious resource, we are hopeful that this winter will recharge our upstream reservoirs to provide us greater storage and supply for next year.

Roads/Streets:

3000 W Update - 3000 W south of the 700 S roundabout is projected to be complete and open to traffic by late November. There is a possibility that minor work may continue through the end of the year with minimal traffic impacts.

2015 ELECTIONS



Syracuse City Municipal Elections

The Syracuse City General Election will be held Tuesday, November 3, 2015. All registered voters will be mailed a vote-by-mail ballot 27 days prior to Election Day. Ballots can be returned by-mail, to a ballot box located within City Hall, or to the Community Center on Election Day. Those wishing to vote in person rather than vote-by-mail will have the opportunity to cast their ballot on voting machines on Election Day; polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Syracuse City Community Center, 1912 W. 1900 S. In order to vote in person, a registered voter must surrender their mailed ballot.

Voter registration can be completed 30 days prior to Election Day via mail, or seven days prior to Election Day online or in person in the office of the Davis County Clerk. Those that are not registered voters may visit the Davis County Website at www.daviscountyutah.gov/clerk/auditor/elections or call or visit the City offices for a copy of the registration form. You must have been a resident of Syracuse City for at least 30 days to be able to participate in the primary election.

Three Councilmember seats are up for election. Based on the results of the Primary Election, those candidates whose names will appear on the General Election ballot are as follows:

*Gary Pratt did receive enough votes to advance from the Primary Election to the General Election, but he withdrew from the race on September 16, 2015.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

A reminder from Code Enforcement. Property owners are responsible for the upkeep of the parking strip in front of their residence per City code. Weeds should not to exceed 6" in height and 12" for undeveloped property. Trees and bushes on parking strips must be cut 7 feet above sidewalks and 11 feet above the street.

Unattached trailers, boats, campers, 5th wheels, etc., are not permitted to be parked on City streets for longer than 24 hours.
